Queensland's New Contemporary Art Gallery

The Asia-Pacific Triennial of Contemporary Art (APT) is the Queensland international contemporary art event. APT5 will include around 270 works by 37 individual artists, filmmakers and performers as well as two multi-artist projects. Highlights will include numerous commissioned works by artists such as Ai Weiwei (China), Dinh Q Lê (Vietnam) and eX de Medici (Australia), as well as the Triennial's strongest representation of Pacific artists to date. Curated cinema and performance programs will bring a dynamic new dimension to APT5, exploring these media on a scale never before presented by the Triennial.

Susan Buret wins Conrad Jupiter’s Prize

Last Saturday night, judge Hossein Valamanesh announced Brisbane based artist **Susan BURET** as the winner of the 2006 Conrad Jupiters Art Prize with her work *Date de Naissance*, (shredded passport, synthetic polymer paint, ink on canvas).

Of the work he said, "I was first attracted to the simplicity and quietness but as I came closer I became aware of its intricate layering and, how beyond that quietness, it was coming with a very powerful message. The patterns which overlay the whole work remind you of a security fence and also of the patterning on a Palestinian scarf - I suppose what I like is that the political message is strong but so subtly expressed - the glow in the middle to me stands for a face - it is like it is a face glowing from the middle of the work."

The Artists Journal - Setting up a STUDIO



...You don't have to have a studio to make art, but you do need a special place where you can get into the art zone and have all your tools and materials close at hand.

Often people start out painting on the kitchen table, having to put everything away just so the family could eat, or they move their art stuff to a corner of the bedroom, using a card table and tv tray as an easel. This can work for a time, but it can be wonderful to transform a porch or a spare room or the garage or or part there of, into a studio.

be creative

Here are some of the basics for an art studio, in no particular order:

- an appropriate work surface (wall, easel or drafting table)
- a small table to hold materials, palette, paints, brushes, water, etc.
- comfortable chair, correct height for work surface
- flat storage for paper and paintings
- shelves for art materials (old bookcases)
- good lighting (full spectrum)
- floor covering that doesn't matter (get cheap carpeting and throw it away if you move.)
- easy access to a cleanup area is good but not necessary in the same room
- radio or cd player
- a white wall space to hang art
- bulletin board

Use containers for pencils, crayons and markers. Keep related materials together-drawing, painting, and framing, etc., so you can find what you need in one place. Try to keep as many things as possible in the open and within reach, so you don't have to dig them out when you need them.

Bring your artists books and the things that inspire you into your space... stick up photocopies of ideas and art that excite you... juice it up... this is a creative space!!

You might want to set up a corner with desk and chair for the business side of your art. Vitally Important Get an answering machine for your phone and train yourself to let it pick up your calls when you're painting. And a sign for the door DON'T DISTURB ARTIST AT WORK!! You'll be surprised what you can accomplish!

Creativity Hint...
